FREEDOM PARK

As the new Freedom Park and Great River Road Learning Center celebrates the park's one year anniversary, the Friends of Freedom Park group marvel at how well it is all coming together.

The Prescott Foundation is proud to have played a major role in completing this once in a lifetime project within the City of Prescott by contributing \$221,621.84 of donor's funds in 2006. The Foundation has now handed off the major responsibilities for operating the Center to the Friends of Freedom Park Board, in partnership with the City of Prescott, and their Parks committee.

The Center has been in operation since Memorial Day weekend 2006 and has enjoyed much success with a variety of educational, social and nature based activities being held in the Park. If you have not had a chance to visit the Center, you are missing a beautiful jewel right in our very own back yard!



CLOCK TOWER

Another landmark achievement in Prescott this past year has been the addition of the wonderful clock tower to downtown. It brings back the chimes that had long ago been quieted and goes to show anything can be accomplished if you work hard enough at it. The Foundation gave a substantial grant to the Clock Tower/Prescott Historical Society and helped play an integral part in fund raising and getting the project completed.

Jerry Voje deserves the credit for spearheading the effort to build the tower and renovate the clock itself. He has put in countless hours and continues to maintain the inner working of the clock. Hopefully the new grand clock tower will stand the test of time and continue to grace the downtown with its wonderful chimes on the hour.
